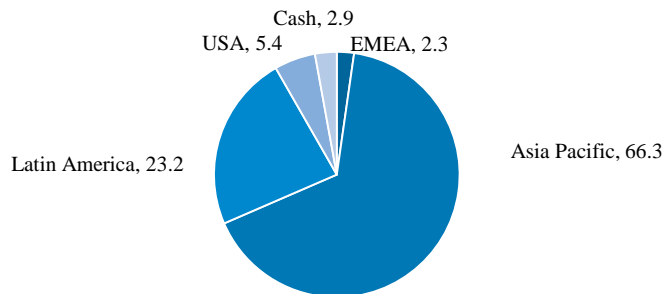

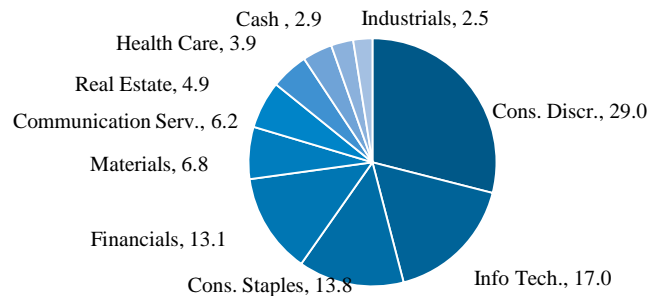

Manager Commentary

The MSCI Emerging Markets Index fell by 7.3% in US dollar terms in May, reducing year-to-date index gains to just over 4%. By region, Asia (-8.8%) was weakest, largely as a result of the deterioration in trade relations between the US and China, followed by EMEA (-3.7%) and Latam (-2.0%). All sectors had negative returns, with the largest declines coming in consumer discretionary stocks (-13.2%).

The largest contributor to returns was the Latin American e-commerce company MercadoLibre, which reported broad-based revenue growth during Q1. India's HDFC Bank performed strongly following the Indian general election, which saw an emphatic victory for incumbent PM Narendra Modi. Kroton, which offers private education in Brazil, was back in favour following a challenging month in April.

The largest detractors from returns were related to the trade dispute between China and the US, in one way or another. Samsonite continued its torrid run in 2019, after reporting a decline in sales and profits as well as explaining that it will need to take further price increases if it is to offset the latest round of tariffs. Ctrip reported a reasonable first quarter but guided to a more challenging environment in Q2. Yum China also reported a reasonable set of quarterly results but its shares declined on concerns of future sales weakness.
