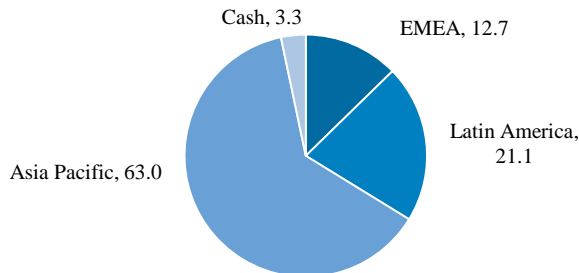

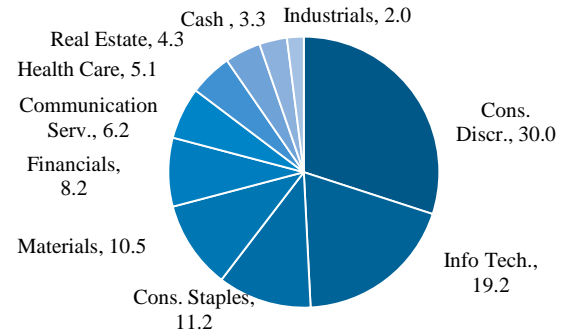

Manager Commentary

In comparison with most of 2018, September was a relatively benign month for the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, which declined by 0.5%. By region, there was a partial recovery for Latin America (+4.7%) and emerging EMEA (+1.8%) but Asia (-1.7%) weighed on the overall Index return. The best performing sector by some margin was energy (+7.2%) as the oil price exceeded \$80 for the first time since 2014. The consumer discretionary (-3.6%) and technology (-3%) sectors lagged, both of which are being affected by the latest GICS re-classification.

It was a quiet month from a corporate news perspective because most of the first-half reporting was complete by the end of August. The largest contributors to Fund returns were our Mexican and Brazilian holdings. Becele, which owns the Jose Cuervo tequila brand, has seen its shares recover in anticipation of an improved sales and profit performance following an underwhelming first half. Mexico's largest independent cable company Megacable has enjoyed a period of excellent operational performance during the first half of 2018 and the share price has responded accordingly. Brazil's Localiza and Kroton both saw improved share price performance, having been caught in the market downdraft during August.

The largest detractors from Fund returns were our Asian-focused holdings, including Ayala Land, Samsonite and Yum China. A private equity consortium withdrew its bid for Yum China after the company rejected its offer. Samsonite's share price drifted lower, most likely on concerns about new US tariffs imposed on luggage manufactured in China. We met with management in Hong Kong and London during the month and came away satisfied that the company is well-positioned to deal with these new challenges. Interestingly, we also met with the management of Ayala Land, a real estate developer in the Philippines, who explained that they had been in contact with Chinese companies that are looking to set up manufacturing in the Philippines in order to circumvent the new tariffs.
